PASTOR'S ARTICLE

Happy Fall Y'all! November ushers in cooler temps and shorter daylight days and Stewardship Season here at Celebration. I want to pose to you a simple concept or foundation for your personal Stewardship considerations and commitments for the coming year – 2020 (Can you believe it is really 2020?).

In his book titled *The Rhythm of Life – Living Everyday with Passion and Purpose*, author **Matthew Kelly** offers some great suggestions for our personal stewardship in a chapter titled: *Be the Difference That Makes the Difference (pages 275-277)*.

Make a difference. It is not that hard. Make the habit of making another person's day. Every day.

Have you ever received an unexpected letter? I love to receive letters, and I am fortunate to receive many, every day, from people all around the world. They come from family and close friends and also from people I have never met. It's a wonderful feeling to receive an unexpected letter—the excitement teetering on impatience as you open the envelope. Yet for most people it is a rare joy.

...Write an unexpected letter today. Write a letter to an old friend whom you haven't seen in years or to someone you love whom you haven't written to in a while. It isn't hard; it doesn't take that much. Write a short note on a small piece of paper, put it in an envelope, address the envelope, and take it down to your post office. It will cost you the price of the postage stamp and five minutes of your time to make someone's day.

Or when was the last time you bought someone a box of chocolates or a bunch of flowers? Not because it's someone's birthday or anniversary or for any reason other than to brighten up his or her day. When was the last time you baked someone chocolate chip cookies?

When was the last time you sat down with people you love and told them of your love for them? It's best to express it in your actions, but it doesn't hurt to say it. Perhaps you are married. When was the last time you told your spouse how much he or she means to you? When was the last time you sat your husband or wife down and said, "You know, for me, you are the sun, rain, fire, ice, New York, L.A. and every town along the way"? It doesn't take much, but it makes a difference.

Whisper, "I love you," in your sleeping child's ear.

These things may seem simple and external, but they reflect a much deeper quality in a person. Spiritually, we strive to be patient because God is patient, we seek to be kind because God is kind, we try to be humble and gentle because they are the ways of God, we seek to love and be loved because God is love.

Yet above everything else, beyond everything else, before everything else—God is a giver. God always gives. He never takes. He only gives. Always giving. Giving is God's life and existence. For God, giving is the perpetual motion of His being. That is why to give a box of chocolates or a bunch of flowers, or to take time to write a letter, is an act of greatness. It is an act of greatness because it is an act that emerges from the heart and mind of God. If all our actions could be performed with this disposition, we would be living life to the fullest.

I promise you with absolute certitude that there is no faster, surer way to share in the life, the power, and the infinite joy of God than to give.

Give of your time, give of your talents, and give of your resources to make a difference in other people's lives. It is the way of greatness. This is the way of God. It is the way of legends, heroes, stars, champions, leaders and saints. I hope and pray that it becomes your way, and mine.

SESSION REPORT

The session reviewed the article, *The Gifts of a Small Church*. Each session member shared their favorite part of Celebration. Elders shared that the church has a warm and friendly feeling, allows you the opportunity to grow and learn new things as you are serving the church, has closeness, has a high percentage of participation, and gives that family friendly feeling you get as you enter the door.

The session continues to review the finances of the church and look for opportunities to grow the church and expand our reach. For the month of September we were in the black by \$21.75. The next finance committee meeting is November 6, at 5:30pm.

Fall on Broadway II was a success, raising over \$5,600. Thank you to all.

Old Business: A motion was made and approved to provide the Swing Family, the missionaries in the Bahamas, \$800 and the special music fund with \$200 from FOB proceeds. This was due to CFHS not participating this year so funds were reallocated.

As we continue through the year finances continue to be a concern. The Endowment Fund currently has \$47,555. The principle is \$36,000 and the rest is interest. A motion was made and approved to move 80% of the interest to the general operating account if monthly mortgage and payroll could not be met. This is approximately \$7,000 depending on the market. The preference is not to touch the money unless necessary so there is a reserve in case of a larger expense.

There was a discussion around community events and how we could be more involved in the community outside the church to share about Celebration's mission and ministries to the community. Suggestions included attending the Carolina Forest Civic Club meeting, involvement in library events and working with the recreation center on events.

Evangelism has had several movie suggestions from the congregation and continues to offer monthly movie nights- November's movie is "Waiting for Butterflies" on November 12 at 6pm.

On November 17, at 4pm, at Trinity Presbyterian in Surfside, a service of Thanksgiving and Gratitude through song will be jointly hosted by Celebration's and Trinity's choirs.

The Youth will be selling Belk Charity Days tickets to be used on November 9, and looking at various options for the summer of 2020.

The property committee was thrilled to announce the new cross had been added with electricity to the side of the building. Along with the 10 volunteers on work day and bush hogging, this added to the vibrancy of the property.

Preschool: A motion was made and approved to increase tuition for 2020-2021 school year by \$5 and to increase the payment to Celebration to \$3,800 a month. A motion was made and approved to test additional preschool services including early bird drop off, brunch bunch and total lunch bunch experience.

The meeting was ended with Good of the Order concerns followed by prayer.

HOSPITABLE FAITH

This month as we celebrate Thanksgiving, we present an article about hospitable faith. Think about how you can show your hospitable faith. -Elder Pettijohn

"Hospitable Faith" by Gina Yeager-Buckley - October 15, 2019 In Re: Ruling Elders

"Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today.' So he hurried down and was happy to welcome him" (Luke 19:5–6).

Zacchaeus gets a bad rap in the biblical character personality review. He's a tax collector. Actually, he is a ruler among the tax collectors as the passage offers. Which essentially translates into "despised bureaucrat" who not only takes the peoples' money but bosses the other people who also take the peoples' money.

Zacchaeus is not a popular, beloved, sought-after neighbor or citizen in Jericho. So, it's quite the biblical surprise when, without a moment of hesitation, Zacchaeus hops down out of the tree and welcomes Jesus into his home.

At the 2019 Presbyterian Youth Triennium, Christian speaker, writer, and theologian Sandra Van Opstal, offered another perspective on Zacchaeus. Van Opstal offers that Zacchaeus is so much more than a "wee little man." He was a man who responded to Jesus' need for a roof and a meal with no hesitation. He was a person who received and provided true hospitality. No polite demurring words or warnings about Jesus potential loss of reputation if seen eating at Zacchaeus' home. No (at least from what we can distill) worried preparations or fretful hand-wringing at the thought of entertaining the son of God. No.

With Zacchaeus there was simply the sense of pleasure. He was "happy" to welcome Jesus. Van Opstal went on to describe the interaction of Jesus and Zacchaeus as "the ultimate description of hospitality." The ease to share one's need (Jesus) and the eagerness to respond to the need of another (Zacchaeus).

We tend to think of hospitality as something we offer. And within that offer there is effort, preparation, planning, execution of the plan, clean up, etc. It seems that hospitality equals work. That hospitality involves "sacrifice."

But hospitality is actually very simple. Profound, in fact, in its simplicity. Hospitality happens within the tiny, almost imperceptible movements and moments of life. First, hospitality happens when we NOTICE. Second, hospitality happens when we OPEN ourselves. Third, hospitality happens when we GIVE and finally, when we RECEIVE.

...When you refuse to give, holding on tightly to everything you have, you live in the realm of lack and limitation. When you give, you perform a significant and vital attitude change. By giving, you express abundance—and what you express in thought, word, and action will become the reality of your life. Here, veiled mysteriously by the act of giving, we discover the abundant life.

When you give to assist in someone else's need, you learn very quickly that the satisfaction of giving is greater than the satisfaction of having.

As time goes by, you realize that many of the things you once thought you needed, you don't really need. With this realization of your own abundance, you are able to give more. Have you noticed that although God is always giving, He is never without? God is not lack or limitation—God is abundance. For God, giving is like breathing—let it become so for you and for me, and our lives will be full of excitement, passion, satisfaction, contentment, and fulfillment.

...Finding our place in the world, finding our place in our local community, and making a difference in our own way all give meaning, purpose, and a deep, deep sense of fulfillment to our lives. We must not only find it for ourselves but help every individual to find the same. — Matthew Kelly
