PASTOR'S ARTICLE

WE ARE CALLED TO LOVE!

Jesus said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' Matthew 22:37-39

I come into the peace of wild things who do not tax their lives with forethought of grief. I come into the presence of still water. And I feel above me the day-blind stars waiting with their light. SOUPER BOWL OF CARING

The Youth will be participating in the Souper Bowl of Caring on Sunday, February 2. They are asking each person to bring a canned/staple good and \$1.00 per person. 100% of what is collected will go to Helping Hand. Thank you for supporting our youth.

HELPINGHAND

In 2019 you donated 983 pounds of food to Helping Hand. Helping Hand is a short-term crisis and referral agency which seeks to address the needs of our community not met by other existing institutions. Their mission is to assist individuals and families with immediate, short-term needs such as food, rent, utilities, and other specialized services, which if not met, would threaten an individual's or family's stability. By providing these services Helping Hand seeks to prevent those in need of basic services from falling into homelessness.

Canned or boxed food along with personal hygiene items are needed. We collect the items here and take them to Helping Hand.

To date in 2020 you have donated 38 pounds of food.

CONGREGATIONS

This month we look at the PCUSA Book of Order to learn about Congregations (from Book of Order, G-1.01)

The Mission of the Congregation The congregation is the church engaged in the mission of God in its particular context. The triune God gives to the congregation all the gifts of the gospel necessary to being the Church. The congregation is the basic form of the church, but it is not of itself a sufficient form of the church. Thus congregations are bound together in communion with one another, united in relationships of accountability and responsibility, contributing their strengths to the benefit of the whole, and are called, collectively, the church.

Through the congregation, God's people carry out the ministries of proclamation, sharing the Sacraments, and living in covenant life with God and each other. In the life of the congregation, individual believers are equipped for the ministry of witness to the love and grace of God in and for the world. The congregation reaches out to people, communities, and the world to share the good news of Jesus Christ, to gather for worship, to offer care and nurture to God's children, to speak for social justice and righteousness, to bear witness to the truth and to the reign of God that is coming into the world.

The Fellowship of the Congregation The polity of the Presbyterian Church (USA) presupposes the fellowship of women, men, and children united in covenant relationship with one another and with God through Jesus Christ. The organization rests on the fellowship and is not designed to work without trust and love.

Governed by the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA) A "congregation," as used in this Form of Government, refers to a formally organized community chartered and recognized by a presbytery as provided in this Constitution. Each congregation of the Presbyterian Church (USA) shall be governed by this Constitution. The members of a congregation put themselves under the leadership of the session and the higher councils (presbytery, synod, and General Assembly). The session is responsible to guide and govern the life of the congregation. The session leads the congregation in fulfilling its responsibilities for the service of all people, for the upbuilding of the whole church, and for the glory of God.

ASHWEDNESDAY

For the third year, Celebration Presbyterian Church is offering a drive-thru service for ashes on Wednesday, February 26, from 4:30-6pm. Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of blessing ashes made from the palm branches from the previous year's Palm Sunday, and use these ashes to place a cross with a blessing on the heads of participants.

Ash Wednesday starts the Lenten season, which is an observance of the 40 days before Easter Sunday and represents the time Jesus fasted in the wilderness before being tempted by Satan.

Often people are too busy to take time for spiritual renewal but with Drive-Thru Ashes we are offering a way for the community to take a few minutes and reflect and renew.

With the busy community in Carolina Forest, we reached not only our church members last year but members of the community. All are welcome to participate.
