### SESSION REPORT

Generative time- Peace be with you. We shared with each other Christmas traditions that were meaningful to us. Some reflected on family traditions, other spiritual services and some work in the community.

The Finance Committee provided an update. With Preschool back in session and the sharing of expenses the bottom line is now in the black. The overall Stewardship giving for 2020 is down but there is still time to provide your estimate of giving.

A discussion around steeple repair was robust. The church has located a grant opportunity for small church repairs that if approved would cover the cost of the steeple repair. The grant announcement will be made in March and the session will revisit the repair when all information is available.

The Finance Committee and Session approved to move forward with a mortgage refinance application with Anderson Brothers Bank. The Session is also exploring New Harmony Presbytery paying off the current mortgage and become the mortgage holder. Either of these option will decrease the monthly payment and help with the church's month to month expense management.

Special offerings for 2020. Everyone is welcome to contribute on their own but envelopes for special offerings will not be placed in the bulletin.

Mission will continue with Helping Hand in 2020. A blood drive will be hosted at the church on January 15 from 3:00-7:30pm. See Nanette Kelly to sign-up. The schedule for Shepherd's Table for 2020 has been completed. We will continue with five teams. Sneaker collection for Salvation Army is at 78.

Worship - The cantata was streamed on Facebook and is available for replay. The opportunity to move forward with sharing our church with others through livestream will continue. Christmas Eve service will be at 5pm and invitations were sent to the preschool families inviting them to join the service.

The Ladies Christmas Luncheon at Pine Lakes was well received. The toys collected for the Salvation Army filled Jeanne's Escape.

Tom's microphone is still creating feedback and continues to be a work in progress to decrease the static.

New members of Session will have training in January and be installed on February 2.

In 2019 you donated 983 pounds of food to Helping Hand. Their mission is to assist individuals and families with immediate, shortterm needs such as food, rent, utilities, and other specialized services, which if not met, would threaten an individual's or family's stability. By providing these services Helping Hand seeks to prevent those in need of basic services from falling into homelessness.

Canned or boxed food along with personal hygiene items are needed. We collect the items here and take them to Helping Hand.

### Elder Pettijohn Explains Presbyterian Per Capita

The official definition: "Per capita is an opportunity for all communicant members of the Presbyterian church through the governing bodies to participate equally, responsibly, and interdependently by sharing the cost of coordination and evaluation of mission; and of performing ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions that identify a Reformed Church, while at the same time strengthening the sense of community among all Presbyterians" (GA Minutes, Part I, 1995).

Per capita is just a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (USA.). It is a Presbyterian Covenant Community Fund -- part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. Because every Presbyterian shares in the benefit of the PC(USA)'s system of government, the expenses associated with coordinating and performing the functions of that system should be shared by everyone as well.

We pay dues to the organizations to which we belong. Per capita is basically our dues to the church. It is a tradition in the Presbyterian Church going back to Philadelphia in 1734. Congregations (through their sessions) pay an annual amount of money per church member -- per capita apportionment -- to their respective presbyteries. The per capita amount requested from a congregation is a combined total of requests from that congregation's presbytery, the synod in which the presbytery is located, and the General Assembly (GA) -- based on their respective budgets for the coming year.

At each GA, the per capita rate is set by dividing the total GA-approved budget by the total PC(USA) church membership. At the GA level, per capita helps to pay for sending commissioners to GA, training events, exams for future pastors, various committees, some expenses of the moderator, the historical society, and interchurch events. At Synod and Presbytery levels, per capita pays for administration and programs for members. Per capita makes it possible for Presbyterians to govern ourselves the way we do. Our Constitution provides a moral and theological compass that builds community and calls us to Christian faithfulness in gratitude to God.

For 2020 the per capita (dues per person) that <u>Celebration pays amounts to \$16.21</u>. This is broken down into **\$5.76** for our <u>Presbytery</u>, **\$1.50** for our <u>Synod</u>, and **\$8.95** for our <u>General Assembly</u>. Each year, each church is asked to pay its fair share. Our share is \$16.21 per person. Celebration pays per capita for each member each year. But since many of us do not come from a Presbyterian background, we might not be aware of the per capita system. In many Presbyterian churches, members are asked to pay per capita over and above their estimate of giving pledges as this helps the church focus on its main mission.

Those people who would like to help Celebration Church by paying their own yearly dues (in addition to their pledges) are greatly appreciated. Just write a check for **\$16.21** <u>per person</u> (or whatever you can afford) to *Celebration Presbyterian Church*. Thank you.
